## **High Park Nature - Stewards**

The High Park Stewards will be starting on-site sessions in May and other groups have on-line meetings and recordings to help you learn about native plants and invasive species.

**High Park Stewards field events are on the horizon!** Unless there are **changes to the current situation**, High Park Stewards field events will begin Sunday, May 8th. As with the previous two years, Stewards must register in advance to attend an event – no drop-ins will be permitted at this time.

Each scheduled event will run from 10:30am – 12:30pm; can accommodate up to 15 participants; will occur on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month, from May to November, excluding holiday weekends.

As we transition through changes in regulations, we will continue to monitor health and safety protocols. Currently, implemented protocols include appropriate personal protective equipment and hygiene protocols. Anyone exhibiting <u>symptoms of COVID-19</u> will not be permitted to participate.

Thank you for your patience and understanding as we work to maintain the health and safety of both the public and our staff during this evolving situation.
